## Beautiful Thoughts from our PC President Cristina Iusco about the pastoral visit of Very Rev. Fr. Daniel Adrian Ene, the Vicar of the Metropolis and the Dean of East Coast Deanery

It is a few minutes before midnight, after a long day of my daughter's birthday, work and a long afternoon filled with the service of the Holly Unction.

For those who do not know, on Wednesday we gathered together for this service and if you listen carefully to the prayers ,the gospels, you realize, we are so small, we are all in a way or the other (physical or mental and spiritual) sick or in in need of help. If you never participated to this service, please make it a priority to attend the next time we have one. But, this is not why I'm writing this at midnight. I'm somehow too little and I know not enough from the theological point of view, to share things about this service. I will let this to fr Vasile. I want to share with you all, something I realized tonight. My worlds were colliding tonight. The priest of my childhood, who passed away 2 years ago, was somehow represented tonight by Fr. Onisie. My childhood priest, Fr. Dunca (memory eternal) and Fr. Onisie, went to

the same theological school together. After the service, I sat with fr Onisie and talked. So good to hear the specific accent and language from the same part of the country we both are. He said something very interesting: when you and your childhood friend get together, you relive parts of your life. It is therapy, he said. So it was therapeutic to speak, to hug and laugh with him tonight. And to remember our dear Fr. Dunca.

And then I got to see and hug Fr. Nick. And Fr. Nicolae and I got to talk to him a little as well. Father, we will pray for you! All these priests somehow shaped my life as an orthodox Christian. This is where my worlds met. In church. Past and future. Childhood and adulthood. All under God's watch for each period of my life from a child to my adult life, with Fr. Vasile as a spiritual father now. We all have a story of how and when or what the church or the priests we came in contact with, helped us. How they shaped us. How they were and are parts of us even when they are gone. And for that, I thank all of them. Tonight, we got to listen Fr. Daniel Ene. What an amazing miracle God made for him. He saved his life and doctors could not explain the miracle of life he was given. I have a feeling it is not the last time I will be listening to father Ene's sermons. So this is my story and the presence of these priests in my life. Maybe, take a moment and think about yours. May God grant them all heath and divine guidance and grace and to Fr. Dunca ,memory eternal!

#### **Palm Sunday**

On Sunday, five days before the Passover of the Law, the Lord came from Bethany to Jerusalem. Sending two of His disciples to bring Him a foal of an ass, He sat thereon and entered into the city. When the multitude there heard that Jesus was coming, they straightway took up the branches of palm trees in their hands, and went forth to meet Him. Others spread their garments on the ground, and yet others cut branches from the trees and strewed them in the way that Jesus was to pass; and all of them together, especially the children, went before and after Him, crying out: "Hosanna: Blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel" (John 12:13). This is the radiant and glorious festival of our Lord's entry into Jerusalem that we celebrate today.

The branches of the palm trees symbolize Christ's victory over the devil and death. The word Hosanna means "Save, I pray," or "Save, now." The foal of an ass, and Jesus' sitting thereon, and the fact that this animal was untamed and considered unclean according to the Law, signified the former uncleanness and wildness of the nations, and their subjection thereafter to the holy Law of the Gospel.
